



After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, loving God, according to his command,

*All:* **we remember his death,  
we proclaim his resurrection,  
we await his coming in glory;**

*Presider:* and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit.




**Patronal Festival Reception**—Today we will celebrate the Patronal Festival of our Cathedral on the Feast of The Conversion of St Paul (a Holy Day in our Anglican Church's calendar). Last year, your cathedral choir offered a wonderful luncheon following the morning service and, until our recent building issues, had arranged to do the same this year. However, given our sacred use of Cronyn Hall as our current worship space, the choir has reconsidered how best to mark the occasion.

The **Patronal Festival Reception** will take place in a decorated Fellowship Centre, and for those unable to manage the stairs, in the Assembly Room and Guild Room. This will consist of wonderful, waiter-served hors d'oeuvres, wine, and soft drinks and will take place immediately after the morning service.

There will be no charge for this reception - it is entirely a contribution to the parish community from the choir - although opportunity will be provided for donations for those who wish to do so.

**Please plan to stay after this morning's service** and join with our Cathedral Choir in fellowship and celebration of all that makes St Paul's Cathedral the vibrant family that we know it to be.

**MARMALADE** - The oranges have arrived and the making of our famous 'St. Paul's Cathedral' marmalade will start on Monday. We will be making marmalade every day for the next two weeks. This is a project that both the ladies and gentlemen of the Parish can take part in. The sign up sheets are on the notice board in the kitchen for both the cutting of the oranges (mostly by the ladies) and the stirring of the marmalade (mostly by the gentlemen). **Support for our Daily Bread Food Bank** – We have offered to support the Daily Bread Food Bank by collecting supplies that they may need. Nominees must be at least 16 years of age (nominees for warden must be at least 18 years of age), baptized, and a member of vestry. A member of vestry is someone who is “identifiably involved with such congregation with regular worship, fellowship and financial support to that congregation.”

**Deanery Bible Study – On Wednesday, February 1** at St. Michael and All Angels, all the Anglican parishes of London will meet to complete a well-received programme of Bible Study. Beginning with dinner at 6pm sharp, and Eucharist at 6:30, the group will assemble for guided readings, with small group and plenary discussion, finishing at 8:00 pm.

This is the last of the four sessions designed to provide London Anglicans from all parishes an opportunity to begin to know one another in study and reflection. Since the union of all parishes into one deanery, there have been a number of community-building initiatives: a day-long seminar for parish administrators, another for all wardens, a session on social-justice ministries, and joint fundraising events - from which came a welcomed Deanery donation to Project Jericho. About 40 people have attended each session, with St James Westminster, St Stephen's, St George's, St. Jude's, St Aidan's and many others all represented by people and priests. On February 1, everyone present will be very happy to see Cathedral members join in with their Deanery friends.
